**Approval of Meeting Minutes:**

The minutes of the June 5, 2009, Illinois State Teacher Certification Board business meeting were presented for consideration. Doug Bower moved that the State Teacher Certification Board accept the minutes of the June 5, 2009, business meeting as written. Eric Brown seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

**Public Participation:**

None.

**Facilitation Committee's Report:**

Doug Bower, Chair of the Facilitation Committee, reported the Facilitation Committee met today at 8:00 a.m. There are no changes to the agenda.

The 2009-2010 Facilitation Committee members include: Doug Bower (Chair); Stephen Breese; Vickie Mahrt; Sr. Colleen McNicholas; and Linda Pellegrini.

**Legal Update: Senate Bill 2071**

Patrick Murphy introduced Jessica Riddick, Assistant Legal Advisor, Legal Department, Illinois State Board of Education (Chicago Office). Ms. Riddick provided an overview of the, "Educator Misconduct Program – Public Act 96-431 (SB 2071) and the Role of the State Teacher Certification Board." It was noted that Part 475 rules (contested cases) will have to be revised to reflect the new structure of the Educator Misconduct Program and Part 485 rules (appeals to the State Teacher Certification Board) will be repealed.

**State Teacher Certification Board Role for Accreditation and Program Approval**

Winnie Tuthill, General Council Division, Illinois State Board of Education, shared the overall picture of the Rulemaking Process.

Dennis Williams, Educator and School Development Division, Illinois State Board of Education, discussed with Certification Board members, "*The Illinois State Teacher Certification Board Role in Higher Education*" document. It outlined procedures for approval of new programs within recognized institutions, procedures for discontinuation of programs, and procedures for accreditation review of the educational unit.

**Item(s) for Immediate Action:**

**Recommendation from Hearing Officer Regarding Gerald Cole**

Patrick Murphy stated the Gerald Cole case went to hearing. Mr. Cole holds a Type 03 and a Type 10 certificate. State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section

21-23 of the School Code to revoke Mr. Cole's certificates on grounds that the conduct that led to the revocation of Mr. Cole's Florida educator's certificate was immoral and unprofessional conduct.

This matter was heard by Hearing Officer David Smith in March of 2009, and in June 2009 Hearing Officer Smith submitted Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, recommending that this matter be dismissed. Dr. Koch filed an exception in this matter, arguing that the burden of proof of preponderance was met.

The State Teacher Certification Board members received copies of Hearing Officer Smith's Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and Dr. Koch's exception.

Mr. Murphy asked Hearing Officer Smith to present the case to members of the Certification Board. Hearing Officer Smith provided a brief overview of the case and his recommended Order. As a matter of law, Hearing Officer Smith indicated his decision could not be based on hearsay evidence which affected Mr. Cole's right to a fair hearing in Florida.

Several members of the Certification Board discussed their concerns that Mr. Cole was not appropriately granted due process and supported the recommendation of dismissal from Hearing Officer Smith.

Doug Bower moved, "that the State Teacher Certification Board hereby adopt the Hearing Officer's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and dismiss the charges against Gerald Cole. At this time we ask the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to advise the parties in writing of our decision." Karen Lewis seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

The Certification Board members declined to have the Order read into the record.

#### Recommendation from Hearing Officer Regarding Stephen Wright

Patrick Murphy stated the Stephen Wright case went to hearing. Mr. Wright holds both Type 09 and Type 75 certificates. State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-23 of the School Code to revoke Mr. Wright's certificates on grounds that the conduct that led to Mr. Wright's dismissal from Downers Grove High School in 2002 was immoral and unprofessional.

This matter was heard by Hearing Officer Carrie Washington in April 2009. In June 2009, Hearing Officer Washington submitted her Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law recommending that Mr. Wright's certificates be suspended for a period of five years. Dr. Koch did not file any exceptions in this case.

The State Teacher Certification Board members received a copy the Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

Mr. Murphy asked Hearing Officer Washington to present the case to members of the Certification Board. Ms. Washington provided a brief overview of the case and her recommended Order. She explained that it is true that the State Superintendent did show that there was unprofessional and immoral conduct on the part of Mr. Wright and the State Superintendent did have cause to revoke the certificates. However, due to the fact that the State Superintendent waited over five years to take any action on the certificate, the recommended Order is that particular action would mitigate any revocation action, she is

recommending suspension of the certificates for five years and Mr. Wright be prohibited from employment at any Illinois public school under the authority of the Illinois School Code and not be issued any new certificates during the five-year suspension period. It was also noted by Hearing Officer Washington that Mr. Wright was issued another certificate from the Regional Superintendent of Education during that period of time as well as no evidence of continued misconduct during two years of employment at Bloom District Trail School District.

There was discussion surrounding the paraprofessional approval held by Mr. Wright. The paraprofessional approval was not brought forth to Hearing Officer Washington. However, if the Certification Board approves of prohibiting Mr. Wright from employment at any Illinois public school, the paraprofessional approval will be covered.

There was much discussion regarding the time it took to set the revocation process in motion, the time spent in employment since the dismissal from Downers Grove and the allowance to apply and obtain a third certificate from the State Board of Education. Since there is no statute of limitations on the amount of time allowed by law, the board members had to consider the best interest of the children, and if there was reoccurring evidence of inappropriate behavior with children.

Doug Bower moved, "that the State Teacher Certification Board hereby reject the Hearing Officer's Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and instead revoke the Standard Secondary Teaching Certificate #1883960 (Type 09) and Administrative Certificate #1408895 (Type 75) of Stephen J. Wright. At this time we ask the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to draft the Order of this action and advise the parties in writing of our decision." Deborah Curtis seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed with one abstention.

#### Revocation of Certificate(s)

Patrick Murphy reminded Certification Board members that at the December 2007 State Teacher Certification Board meeting, the Board moved to allow the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign Orders of Revocation under 21-23(a) on their behalf if the certificate holder did not request a hearing or did not timely request a hearing.

#### Clifton Brookings

Patrick Murphy stated there is no Order for this case. Clifton Brookings' Type 39 certificate at issue has expired and notes have been entered into the Teacher Certification Information System (TCIS) reflecting this. Mr. Brookings will not be issued any future certification unless a thorough review has been conducted.

#### Ira Coward

Patrick Murphy stated Ira Coward holds a Type 34 Provisional Vocational Teaching certificate for Health Occupations and Pharmacy Tech. The Illinois State Board of Education learned that Mr. Coward's Pharmacy license issued by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation had been revoked in 1991 after Mr. Coward falsified information pertaining to the renewal of that license in 1986 and 1988, and failed to advise the State Board of Education of the revocation of that license.

State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-23 of the School Code to revoke Mr. Coward's Type 34 certificate on grounds that Mr. Coward's failure to advise the State Board of Education of the revocation of the Pharmacy license, continuing to hold the

Type 34 certificate and continuing to maintain employment in the public schools using that certificate, was unprofessional conduct.

Mr. Coward did not request a hearing, and so the next step is for the State Teacher Certification Board to revoke Mr. Coward's certificate.

Vickie Mahrt moved that the State Teacher Certification Board adopt the Order to revoke the following certificate of Ira M. Coward (Provisional Vocational Certificate #1441291 – Type 34); and direct the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign the Order. Eric Brown seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

#### David Flowers

Patrick Murphy stated David Flowers holds a Standard Type 03 certificate. In 2001 Mr. Flowers was employed at Christopher Elementary School and was convicted for the offense of Battery (Class A misdemeanor) for inappropriately touching several of his female students under the age of 13. Mr. Flowers was also named as a perpetrator by the Department of Children and Family Services in an indicated report of child abuse on the bases of sexual molestation and substantial risk of harm for that same conduct.

State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-23 of the School Code to revoke Mr. Flowers' Type 03 certificate on grounds that his conduct that led to the Department of Children and Family Services' report and the criminal convictions were immoral and unprofessional conduct.

Mr. Flowers did not request a hearing, and so the next step is for the State Teacher Certification Board to revoke Mr. Flowers' certificate.

Linda Pellegrini moved that the State Teacher Certification Board adopt the Order to revoke the following certificate of David E. Flowers (Standard Elementary Teaching Certificate #2016550 – Type 03); and direct the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign the Order. Phillip Saineghi seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

#### Cecilia Gonzalez-Piedra

Patrick Murphy stated Cecilia Gonzalez-Piedra holds Type 03 and Type 75 certificates. In 2003 Ms. Gonzalez-Piedra was convicted for the offense of Conspiracy to Commit Murder (Class 2 Felony).

State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-23 of the School Code to revoke Ms. Gonzalez-Piedra's certificates on grounds that her conduct that led to her conviction was immoral and unprofessional conduct.

Ms. Gonzalez-Piedra did not request a hearing, and so the next step is for the State Teacher Certification Board to move to revoke Ms. Gonzalez-Piedra's certificates.

Doug Bower moved that the State Teacher Certification Board adopt the Order to revoke the following certificates of Cecilia Gonzalez-Piedra (Standard Elementary Teaching Certificate #1940834 – Type 03; Administrative Certificate #1871179 – Type 75); and direct the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign the Order. Kenneth Jamison seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

Maria Valadez

Patrick Murphy stated Maria Valadez holds a paraprofessional approval. She previously held Type 39 certification which expired on June 30, 2009.

State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-1 of the School Code to revoke Ms. Valadez' Type 39 and paraprofessional approval on grounds that she submitted certification testing documents in her name that the Illinois State Police Forensic Science Division determined were actually completed by someone else.

Ms. Valadez did not request a hearing, and so the next step is for the State Teacher Certification Board to move to revoke Ms. Valadez' certificate and paraprofessional approval. Prior to this case coming to the Certification Board for action, however, the Type 39 certificate expired.

Sr. Colleen McNicholas moved that the State Teacher Certification Board adopt the Order to revoke the Paraprofessional Approval of Maria D. Valadez; and direct the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign the Order. Carol Auer seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

Adam Wallach

Patrick Murphy stated Adam Wallach holds a Standard Type 09 certificate. Mr. Wallach was convicted in 2006 for the offense of False Academic Degree.

State Superintendent Christopher Koch initiated an action under Section 21-23 of the School Code to revoke Mr. Wallach's certificate on grounds that the conduct that led to his conviction was immoral and unprofessional.

Mr. Wallach did not request a hearing, and so the next step is for the State Teacher Certification Board to move to revoke Mr. Wallach's certificate.

Vickie Mahrt moved that the State Teacher Certification Board adopt the Order to revoke the following certificate of Adam J. Wallach (Standard Secondary Teaching Certificate #1720810 – Type 09); and direct the Secretary of the State Teacher Certification Board to sign the Order. Michael Engfer seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

Six-Month Accreditation Report – Quincy University

Ann Behrens, Interim Dean, School of Education, Quincy University, was present.

Phylliss Jones, Educator and School Development Division, Illinois State Board of Education, explained that at the December 2008 meeting of the State Teacher Certification Board, the Board found that Quincy University did not meet Standard 2 of the 2002 Edition National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) Standards with the following finding:

**Standard 2 – Assessment System and Unit Evaluation: Not Met**

- The unit does not have an assessment system that analyzes data on the application qualifications, the candidate and graduate performance, and unit operations to evaluate and improve the unit and its programs.

According to Section 25.125 (j) (2) (A), the State Teacher Certification Board recommended to the State Board that Quincy University be given six months to rewrite and present Standard 2 to the Certification Board. The recommendation went to the State Board at their February 2009 meeting and the State Board agreed to the recommendation. Quincy University has submitted the required information to the Certification Board for their consideration.

The State Teacher Certification Board was asked to determine if the documentation submitted satisfies the conditions expressed or requires a focused visit which shall occur within one year after the semester in which the documentation was submitted.

Sr. Colleen McNicholas moved that the State Teacher Certification Board recommend to the State Board of Education that the documentation submitted by Quincy University satisfies the conditions expressed in the team report dated March 2008 and that Quincy University be granted continuing accreditation of the educational unit [Section 25.125 (j) (2) (B)]. Eric Brown seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote.

#### Review of Previous New Program Proposal(s)

##### *American College of Education – Technology Specialist*

The following representatives from American College of Education were introduced: Robert Myers, Senior Vice President for Regulatory Compliance and Program Expansion; Judy Zimny, Associate Provost for Curriculum Production; Shawntel Landry, Assistant Provost, Program Development, Program Chair, Educational Technology; and Jennifer Banas, Master Professor.

At the June 2009 State Teacher Certification Board meeting the American College of Education brought forth a new program proposal for Technology Specialist. The Certification Board denied approval of the program. The American College of Education has submitted a revised program proposal and asks for a recommendation of approval for their new Technology Specialist program.

After discussion by board members, it was felt the following concerns have been addressed:

- Rubric directly assessing dispositions
- Documentation related to how much is in the portfolio assessment
- Completed faculty matrix (view qualifications of faculty)
- Documentation of the program governance commitment
- Documentation or rubric showing how the field experiences are assessed throughout a range

Doug Bower moved that the State Teacher Certification Board recommend to the State Board of Education provisional approval of the Technology Specialist program at American College of Education, authorizing the educational unit to conduct programs and to recommend candidates for certification by entitlement until the time of the institution's next scheduled Accreditation Review [Section 25.145 (d) (1)]. Kenneth Jamison seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed with one abstention.

## Review of New SPA Reports

### Aurora University: Biology; Social Science History; Physical Education

Doug Bower moved that the State Teacher Certification Board recommend to the State Board of Education approval of the following Aurora University programs in accordance with Section 25.127 (j) (1) (A) of the Board's administrative rules on review of individual programs:

Physical Education  
Science – Biology  
Social Science – History

Sheila Bowens seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion.

Certification Board members raised concerns with regard to the Physical Education program, which did receive national recognition although they have some conditions. It was noted that in the past the State Teacher Certification Board recommended approval of the programs when national recognition was granted.

The motion passed with three abstentions.

## Rules Related to Certification (Various)

There were no rules for consideration.

## Proposals for Activities that Meet Requirements for Standard Certificate Eligibility

Doug Bower moved that the State Teacher Certification Board accept the list of "Proposals for Activities that Meet Requirements for Standard Certificate Eligibility" dated September 1, 2009. Carol Auer seconded the motion. Patrick Murphy called for discussion, but none followed. The motion passed by unanimous vote. (See Attachment)

## Renewal of Standard / Master Certificates (Group B List)

Patrick Murphy reported there are no non-renewals on the Group B List at this time.

## **Item(s) for Information:**

### Principal Preparation

Linda Tomlinson, Assistant Superintendent, School Support Services for All Schools, Illinois State Board of Education; and Debbie Meisner-Bertauski, Associate Director, Academic Affairs, Illinois Board of Higher Education, provided a detailed presentation on the, "Newly Defined Principal Preparation Program for Illinois."

### Pre-Service Standards Advisory Group

Patrick Murphy stated that the State Board of Education requested the State Teacher Certification Board to submit to the State Board recommendations for standards-based outcome approach to the deficiencies identified in the teacher preparation study by Dan Reschley, entitled, "Evaluation of LBS1 Teacher Preparation in Inclusive Practices, Reading and Classroom Organization – Behavior Management."

The Pre-Service Standards Advisory Group has met during the summer and continues to meet to revise the Illinois Professional Teaching Standards, infusing reading and literacy, and addressing gifted, bilingual and special education.

Certification Board members asked if a document could be shared that describes the process, specifically how participants were selected to serve on the advisory group, what the charge of the group is, etc.

### Renewal of Standard / Master Certificates (Report – Group A List)

Patrick Murphy reported that there were 1,107 recommendations for Standard / Master Certificates renewed in Group A for the period of June 1, 2009 through August 31, 2009.

### Moving from Initial to Standard Certificate

Patrick Murphy reported that there were 3,453 recommendations for Initial Certificates moving to Standard Certificates for the period of June 1, 2009 through August 31, 2009.

### **Secretary's Report:**

#### **Educator Certification Division**

Linda Jamali, Division Administrator, Educator Certification Division, reported the following:

#### General

- The division remains within a 31 day processing window for 63 percent of all certificates and endorsements
- There are currently 2,288 certificates/endorsements to be processed
- Approximately 5,000 LBS1 unlimited certificates were mailed on August 31, 2009
- Technology staff continues to work on reformatting the Teacher Certification Information System to allow institutions to add subsequent endorsements

#### During the Period of June 1, 2009 through September 1, 2009:

- 9,839 certificates were issued through transcript evaluation. 3,444 deficiency letters were sent out regarding certificates evaluated through transcript evaluation
- There were 6,667 new certificates issued through entitlement. 231 deficiency letters were sent out regarding entitlement certificates
- In addition, 6,284 substitute certificates were processed and 1,694 duplication certificates were printed

- 1,332 endorsement applications were processed and issued; deficiency letters were sent out for over 1,945 additional endorsement applications
- 1,636 approvals/disapprovals were sent out

### Educator Testing

**New Legislation: HB 2675** was signed on August 25, 2009. Among other things, it removes the testing waiver for content area tests for out-of-state applicants. All out-of-state candidates will need to take the content test and the APT test. Provisional certificates will be valid for two full years – the two year time period also includes testing (up from 9 months to reduce confusion). This means that all out-of-state candidates will need to sit for the content area exam(s) and the APT. Applicants holding a valid out-of-state certificate will not be required to take the Basic Skills Test.

- There were 631 examinees who registered for the Basic Skills computer-based testing (CBT) during the July testing window (July 09 - 15, 2009)
- There were 2,706 examinees who registered to take 2,835 tests during the July 11, 2009, paper-based testing (PBT) administration. That was a supplemental test administration that was offered at six test sites throughout the state
- There were 506 examinees who registered for the Basic Skills computer-based testing (CBT) during the August testing window (August 05 - 10, 2009)
- There are 7,869 examinees who have registered to take 8,655 tests during the September 12, 2009, paper-based testing (PBT) administration. (These figures were run on 9/8/09 before the close of the emergency registration period.)
- The end-of-year Illinois Certification Testing System (ICTS) data reports will be available in early October
- In January, there will be a workshop for content advisory and bias review committees to review test questions for the upcoming computer-based test for Early Childhood. [We will know soon when this test will be offered as a computer-based test (CBT).]
- The Elementary/Middle grades test will be offered as a CBT in March of 2010

### Grow Your Own Teacher Initiative

- The FY 09 fiscal year was extended through 12/31/09 in order to give the sites the opportunity to spend all FY 09 funds and to help them through the delays in the FY 10 grant processes
- In FY 10 the consortia have been funded at 95 percent of the FY 09 levels
- Contracts that don't provide direct services to candidates took steeper reductions to allow for this
- All developmental/remedial coursework must be completed by 12/31/09
- All teacher candidates must pass the basic skills test by August 2010 (prior to the beginning of the Fall 10 semester.)
- Continue to gather projections on the number of candidates and costs related to the program.

### **Educator and School Development Division**

Patrick Murphy reported the following:

Mr. Murphy shared the "2009 Educator Audits by ROE" document. Random audits will be conducted to verify activities listed on Statements of Assurance approved during the time period

of September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2009. Four areas of audits will occur: Administrator (80); School Service Personnel (79); and Teachers (97). Additionally, the NCLB plan requires random audits be conducted for teachers who claim HOUSSE for highly qualified status. The number is 13 for HOUSSE. Eleven Regional Offices of Education have no audits to conduct.
