

The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign Department of Education Policy, Organization and Leadership is looking for teachers with strong leadership potential to enroll in our Educational Administration program to receive their school administrator endorsement. We have just revised our curriculum and started a new partnership with ISBE to strengthen the principal pipeline and make our program more accessible to students from across the state.

Our revamped program includes:

- **Prestigious Illinois Principal Fellowships** for (i) educators of color or (ii) educators from rural school districts, covering tuition, the application fee, and a stipend for other costs.
- Competitive tuition rates for all students
- A **hybrid** instructional model, with in-person attendance two Saturdays each semester and other course meetings held online.
- A masters degree and principal endorsement in two years (5 semesters, including one summer), with options for a doctorate for candidates who already have a masters
- As always: access to Illinois' flagship public university, 100% faculty-taught courses, the largest public university library in the United States, and a top-10-nationally-ranked graduate program in educational administration.
